Samuel Daraviansky married Leah Feltz, who was born in Poland in Mile End Old Town, London in 1909 and had six children born between 1910 and 1925. They changed their name to Daren before their children were born.

The 1939 Register states that Samuel was a ladies gown and mantle dealer, Alexander worked as a ladies and gents tailor and was an Air Raid warden, Nathan was a ladies and gents tailor and volunteer in the Auxiliary Fire Service, Sidney was a ladies tailors cutter and volunteered in the police and Polly was a sales lady at a women's costumier.

An article appeared in the Jewish Chronicle of 1941: 'The three sons of Mr S Daren of 389 Barking Road, East Ham are serving in the RAF. All three were will known in the Jewish Lads' Brigade at Forest Gate and in local club activities. Nathan (27), from May 1939 until his enlistment was in the Auxiliary Fire Service. He was an active speaker on the anti-defamation platform in the Deputies Defence Campaign. Sidney (26) was a War Reserve policeman from January 1939 until he joined up. Reuben (23) matriculated at the East Ham Grammar School. Nathan, who is a Corporal, has unfortunately been posted as missing'.
