Norman Zamek's Final Letter

Norman wrote his last letter to his family dated 12 April 1942 from India. In it he says he realises they must have wondered why he continued his air crew training after his brother was reported missing. He did not feel then there was any other possible alternative and that. 'I am even more sure that this is so, and, in addition, I am determined to do my best to avenge the loss of Ian and so many of my friends in the RAF. For myself, I have no fear of being killed as I know that my life must, in any case, terminate sooner or later. I can think of no greater use for my life than in helping to defend the cause for which we are now fighting. However, I am sure that you will find comfort in the thought that both Ian and myself volunteered our services willingly for ideals for which I am certain that no sacrifice is too great.'
