Dearest Mother, Leslie and Lilian

I am writing this of course in the hope that you will never see it. If, however I should die whilst in the service then this together with my will, will be forwarded to you.

I know this will cause you great distress but thought it better at least to leave a note of some description. If I am to die during this war, I would like you to think that being young as I am, I have enjoyed all my life up till now and have never known the unhappiness and disappointments of later life. If I had the choice again, I think would still have taken this job, as it is the only war job that appeals to me. I feel I will have done my duty as a good Jew, and that I would have despised myself in later years, had I taken any other course.

Thank you all for the care, and attention you gave me whilst I was with you, and especially when I was younger. I have always appreciated everything.

My fondest love to Aunt [indecipherable] Evelyn, Joe, Harry, Ralph and to Pearl with whom I'd planned so much for the future.
